Based on Article 67, Paragraph 1, Sub-Paragraph 1, of the Act on Humanitarian Mine Clearance (the Official Gazette no. 153/05), the Minister of Internal Affairs reaches these

REGULATIONS

ON THE FORM OF THE OFFICIAL IDENTITY CARD AND BADGE OF THE INSPECTOR SUPERVISING THE TASKS OF HUMANITARIAN MINE CLEARANCE

Article 1

These Regulations proscribe the form for the official identity card, the form and visual appearance of the official badge that inspectors of the Ministry of the Internal Affairs carry, who are authorized for the supervision over the performance of the tasks of humanitarian mine clearance, and the method of issuing, replacing and registering issued official identity cards and badges.

Article 2

The forms for the identity cards are created by sublimation printouts on a computer system for the creation of official identity cards TIM-ID, in the size of 85.6 x 54 mm.

The front side of the form from Paragraph 1 of this Article contains:

- In the upper left side, the coat of arms of the Republic of Croatia,
- To the right, on the same level with the coat of arms, the writing in blue, one below the other text: 'REPUBLIC OF CROATIA,' 'MINISTRY OF INTERNAL AFFAIRS' and 'INTERNAL AFFAIRS INSPECTORATE.' Below the coat of arms is the empty space for a photograph.
- Right from the photograph space, and below the inscription 'INTERNAL AFFAIRS INSPECTORATE,' the writing in dark blue 'OFFICIAL IDENTITY CARD.' Below this, in a rectangle of light blue, the name and the surname of the inspector is printed. Below the rectangle, the date of issue is printed, as well as the ordinal number of identity card issue. The front side of the form is protected during the sublimation printout with a transparent plastic protective film, the size of which is 80.6 x 49 mm, and thickness 0.0025 mm, that contains alternately the holograms of the coat of arms of the Republic of Croatia and the letters of 'MUP RH.'

Article 3

On the back side of the form for the identity card, the authorities of the inspector for the supervision over the tasks of humanitarian mine clearance are printed.

Article 4

The official badge of the inspector for the supervision over the tasks of humanitarian mine clearance is of 56 mm size and consists of three concentric circles. In the central circle, on a

radiant background, there are the letters of 'RH' of 9 mm. The middle silver circle is of 41 mm diameter and contains in the upper part the blue inscription of: 'MUP – Inspectorate.' The outer circle is yellow and contains the relief of Croatian braid. The lower part of the badge contains the metal silver ribbon, where badge number is entered.

Article 5

Inspectors for the supervision over the tasks of humanitarian mine clearance, when performing inspection tasks, carry the official identity card and the badge in a leather case.

The leather case from Paragraph 1 of this Article is of dark blue colour, with three bends, while the size of each bend is 80 x 120 mm.

The middle bend of the leather case, from within, contains the official identity card.

The inner bend of the leather case, in its lower part, contains the badge.

Article 6

The official identity card and the badge with the accompanying case are issued by the Ministry of Internal Affairs.

Article 7

Regarding issued identity cards and badges, the Ministry of Internal Affairs keeps a register.

The register from Article 1 of this Article contains: the name and the surname of the inspector who was issued the identity card and the badge and the title of the work place, the registration number of the card and the badge, the date of issue and the space for remarks.

Article 8

The inspector who loses the official identity card or the badge or in any other manner finds himself without his/her identity card i.e. badge must immediately notify the immediate Head regarding this.

The new official identity card or the badge will be issued following the lost or in any manner missing identity card or badge becoming declared void in the Official Gazette.

The inspector who loses the official card or the badge bears the cost of acquiring a new one.

Article 9

The inspector whose employment with the Ministry of Internal Affairs expires, or one who loses the status of the inspector for the supervision over the tasks of humanitarian mine clearance, must surrender the identity card and the badge to the immediate Head, when he/she receives the resolution regarding the termination of employment i.e. the rescheduling to another work place.

The immediate Head must deliver the received official identity card and the badge to the relevant department of the Ministry of Internal Affairs.

Article 10

The forms for the official identity card and the form for the official badge are printed with these Regulations and are its composite part.

Article 11

These Regulations come into force on the eighth day since their publication in the Official Gazette.
